Dial 911 and our firefighters and/or Saturna Island Rescue (SIR) crews should reach you within about ten minutes.

The AGM of SIFPS is on Saturday 16 June at 1 pm in ESB#1. Membership in SIFPS is no longer restricted to invitees but open to all Saturna residents who apply. Think about attending the meeting. Think even more about standing for the Board, as we have barely a quorum at present. (Call SIFPS John Hutchinson to indicate your willingness to stand, his phone number is in the directory.)

And one more thing: although Fire Chief Brent Sohier and SIR Crew Chief Kate Vigneault have sufficient willing volunteers to cover the basic first response calls, they can always use more volunteers. Excellent training is provided. And even one more thing: when I was a firefighter, it really gladdened my heart when recipients of emergency aid were thoughtful enough to send a card and sometimes even enclose a cheque in thanks.
